Commission Comment: PL 8-30, the “Commonwealth Early Retirement Bonus Act,” took effect October 1, 1993.

PL 11-114 which called for the expiration and repeal of PL 8-30 took effect January 18, 2000. PL 11-114 contained purpose, expiration and repealer, severability, and savings clause provisions as follows:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Act is to provide for retirees to receive their 30% bonus subsequent to retiring, and upon receipt of their bonus, to have their retirement pension adjusted retroactive to the date of retirement, with the bonus being factored in.

...

Section 3. Expiration and Repealer. The Commonwealth Early Retirement Bonus Act (PL 8-30) which took effect on October 1, 1993 shall expire and become automatically repealed by this Act on December 15, 1999. The expiration of such law shall not have any effect on the entitlement acquired, pursuant to such law, by any employee or retiree prior to such expiration.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 5. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence at the date this Act becomes effective.
