§ 3303. Old-Age Insurance Benefits: Eligibility.

Every person who:

(a) Is a fully insured individual;

(b) Has attained age:

(1) Sixty years on or before June 30, 1978;

(2) Sixty and one-half years in the period beginning July 1, 1978, and ending February 28, 1979;

(3) Sixty-one years in the period beginning March 1, 1979, and ending October 31, 1979;

(4) Sixty-one and one-half years in the period beginning November 1, 1979, and ending June 30, 1980; or

(5) Sixty-two years on or after July 1, 1980; and

(c) Has filed application for old-age insurance benefits shall be entitled to an old-age insurance benefit for each month beginning with the month of January 1976, for which both subsections (a) and (b) of this section are satisfied and ending with the month preceding the month in which he dies, subject to the earnings test as provided in 3 CMC § 3312.
