

TITLE 6: CRIMES AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
DIVISION 4: DISPOSITION OF OFFENDERS

§ 4101. Fines.

A person who has been convicted of any offense under this title, unless a fine is elsewhere prescribed by law, in addition to any other punishment authorized by law, may be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding:

(a) \$10,000 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of 10 years imprisonment;

(b) \$5,000 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of five years imprisonment;

(c) \$1,000 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of one year imprisonment;

(d) \$500 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of six months imprisonment;

(e) \$50 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of 30 days imprisonment;

(f) Any higher amount equal to double the pecuniary gain obtained from the offense by the defendant; or

(g) Any higher amount specifically authorized by statute.
