TITLE 9: VEHICLE CODE DIVISION 2: REGISTRATION AND LICENSES

§ 2204. Persons Unqualified for License.

An operator's license shall not be issued to any person:

- (a) Under the age of 16 years;
- (b) Determined to be a habitual drunkard or addicted to the use of narcotic drugs;
- (c) Previously adjudged insane or an idiot, imbecile, epileptic or feeble minded; or
- (d) Afflicted with or suffering from a physical or mental disability or disease that prevents the person from exercising ordinary control over a motor vehicle while operating it.
- (e) Who has not successfully completed a Driver's Education Program, as provided in Article 4 of this chapter, if:
 - (1) The applicant has never been issued an operator's license by a government under the jurisdiction of the United States or a foreign country; or,
 - (2) The applicant has previously been issued an operator's license by any governmental jurisdiction, and that license has been suspended or revoked within one year of application for a CNMI operator's license.
