**A LOCAL APPROPRIATIONS BILL FOR AN ACT
FOR THE SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT**

To appropriate the amount of **\$403,737.00** from the payment of arrears on license fee **and taxes** received from the Tinian Dynasty Hotel and Casino for payment of the retroactive salary adjustments under Public Law 7-31 for all entitled employees on Tinian; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE FIFTEENTH TINIAN LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION AND THE ELEVENTH TINIAN MUNICIPAL COUNCIL:

1 Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate the amount of
2 **\$403,737.00** earmarked under Section 404(f) of the Tinian Local Ordinance 11-01 for
3 payment of retroactive salary adjustments under Public Law No. 7-31 for all entitled
4 employees on Tinian.

5 Section 2. Appropriation. The amount of **\$403,737.00** earmarked and deposited
6 into a special account pursuant to Section 404(f) of the Tinian Local Ordinance 11-01 is
7 hereby appropriated for payment of retroactive salary adjustments under Public Law No.
8 7-31 for all entitled employees on Tinian.

9 Section 3. Certification of Entitled Employees. The Director of the Office of
10 Personnel Management shall compile and certify the **names** of all employees on Tinian

1 entitled for payment of retroactive salary adjustments under Public Law No. 7-31 and the
2 amount of entitlement for each employee.

3 Section 4. Disbursement of Payments. Any employee entitled to a retroactive
4 salary adjustment in an amount less than \$5,000.00 shall receive his or her salary
5 adjustment payment in full. Any employee entitled to a retroactive salary adjustment in
6 an amount greater than \$5,000.00 shall receive a partial payment in the amount not to
7 exceed \$5,000.00. Under no circumstances shall any entitled employee receive an initial
8 partial payment greater than \$5,000.00. The remaining balance of said appropriation
9 shall then be distributed in equal amounts to those employees whose entitlement exceeds
10 \$5,000.00 until funds shall be exhausted.

11 Section 5. Expenditure Authority. The Tinian Municipal Treasurer shall certify
12 and the Mayor of Tinian and Aguiquan shall approve said payments.

13 Section 6. Reprogramming. Funds appropriated herein under Section 2 shall be
14 available without fiscal year limitation and shall not be reprogrammed.


15 Section 7. Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application of any
16 such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of
17 competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to
18 persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected
19 thereby.

20 Section 8. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not
21 be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under


1 liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes
2 effective.

3 Section 9. **Effective Date.** This Act shall take effect upon its adoption by the **Tinian**
4 Legislative Delegation and concurrence of the Tinian Municipal Council and then the approval
5 of the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.






