Dear Mr. Chairman and Mr. Speaker:

This is to inform you that I have signed into law, with the exceptions of several disapproved parts, House Local Bill 19-70, RLD S2 as passed by the Rota Legislative Delegation of the Nineteenth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature.

H.L.B. 19-70, RLD S2 appropriates \$2 million allotted to the First Senatorial District under Public Law 18-56. However, I have serious concerns with some of the appropriations, and based on the reasons set forth below, I disapprove of the following parts of the enactment:

VEETOED PARTS OF THE ENACTMENT

Section 2(b)

This provision appropriates \$250,000 to the Rota Municipal Government employees, but does not specify the use of those funds. Without those details, the appropriation violates the Public Purpose statute.


Section 2(d)

This provision appropriates \$7,000 each to Dr. Rita Inos Jr./Sr. High School and Sinapalo Elementary School for textbooks, sports equipment, and minor facility repairs, under the expenditure authority of the Secretary of Finance. This is unconstitutional. The Commissioner of Education should have been designated as the expenditure authority pursuant to Article XV, §1(b) of the Constitution.

In closing, I agree with the intent of much of the bill and understand the importance of these public funds toward improving the lives of the people of the First Senatorial District. I do however urge the Delegation to specify the use of funds in order to conform with the Public Purpose statute in future appropriation measures.

H.L.B. 19-70, RLD S2, with the exception of the vetoed portions, becomes **Rota Local Law No. 19-12**. Copies bearing my signature are forwarded for your reference.



**A LOCAL APPROPRIATION BILL FOR AN ACT
FOR THE FIRST SENATORIAL DISTRICT**

To appropriate Two Million US Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) specifically allotted to the First Senatorial District under Public Law No. 18-56; and for other purposes.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE FIRST SENATORIAL DISTRICT DELEGATION PURSUANT
TO CHAPTER 4, DIVISION 1, TITLE 1 OF THE COMMONWEALTH CODE:**

1 **SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND PURPOSE.**

2 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds specifically allotted to the First
3 Senatorial District under Public Law No. 18-56.

4 **SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.**

5 Notwithstanding any provisions, statutes, laws or regulations to the contrary, the Rota
6 Legislative Delegation hereby appropriates the amount of Two Million US Dollars
7 (\$2,000,000.00) of the funds allotted to the First Senatorial District under Public Law No. 18-
8 56 for the following:

9 (a) \$1,550,000.00 for the payment of the twenty five percent (25%) retirement-cut
10 restoration for the retirees and surviving beneficiaries of the First Senatorial District residing
11 on Rota and outside of Rota under the expenditure authority of the Secretary of the Department
12 of Finance;

RT 1 ~~(b) \$250,000.00 Rota Municipal Government employees under the expenditure~~
2 ~~authority of the Rota Mayor;~~

3 (c) \$105,600.00 for the purpose of providing subsistence allowance for residents of
4 the First Senatorial District who are undergoing hemodialysis and terminally ill patients. The
5 payment for each patient shall be in the amount as shown in Attachment A;

RI 6 ~~(d) \$14,000.00 for payment of \$7,000.00 each to Dr. Rita Inos Jr./Sr. High School~~
7 ~~and Sinapalo Elementary School for textbooks, sports equipment, and minor facility repairs.~~
8 ~~The expenditure authority shall be the Secretary of Finance;~~

9 (e) \$5,000.00 for the Rota Casino Gaming Commission under expenditure authority
10 of the Chairperson of the commission;

11 (f) \$10,000.00 for the Rota Municipal Scholarship Foundation under the
12 expenditure authority of the Chairperson of the Rota Municipal Scholarship Foundation;

13 (g) \$10,000.00 for partial payment of \$5,000.00 each for SEAS and Asian-West
14 Development, Inc. (former Paradise Hotel) under the expenditure authority of the Rota Mayor;

15 (h) \$10,000.00 for payment of \$5,000.00 each for Dr. Classens and Dr. Toskas for
16 services rendered to the Rota municipality pursuant to an agreement. See Attachment B. The
17 expenditure authority shall be the Secretary of Finance;

18 (i) \$6,000 for an allotment of \$3,000.00 each for the Eskuelan San Francisco De
19 Borja and Grace Christian Academy, and for non-religious textbooks, sports equipment, and
20 minor facility repairs. The expenditure authority shall be the Secretary of Finance; and

21 (j) \$39,400.00 for the operations of the Office of the Mayor of Rota under the
22 expenditure authority of the Rota Mayor.

1 **SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.**

2 If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or
3 circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this
4 Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it
5 is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

6 **SECTION 4. SAVINGS CLAUSE.**

7 This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any
8 existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule,
9 regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect
10 any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not
11 have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which
12 shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.


13 **SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.**



Thank for the March 1998 conditions of my accepting a contract from RHC. The key is three providers and 2 work days off per week . I accept your offer with the following stipulations:

1. If there are less than 3 providers, my days off per week will increase.
2. if I must work on one of the guaranteed two days off I will be paid 1.5 times my hourly rate or get 2 days leave for every day of extra work, my choice
3. this signing contract and my contract terms will carry on to every renewal
4. I will be the Medical Director with sole responsibility for making all MD schedules, call, leave ,etc. and my decision will be final
5. the Mayor and the RD at the time will be personally liable for breach of this agreement, not dischargable by bankruptcy
6. the penalty for breach of this signing agreement will be two years salary plus punitive damages

AGREEMENT

This is to state that Mr. Luis Sablan, in his capacity as Resident Director(RD)of Rota Health Center(RHC), agrees that 2 (two) days of administrative leave will be given as compensation for every day that Dr. Francois P. H Claassens works as physician at the RHC, which is in excess of his regular work schedule. This agreement is based upon the arrangement that has been in effect for Dr. James Toskas and Dr. Rodney Klassen under the management of RD Sandra Mangiona and the Mayor of Rota, Benjamin Mangiona and as such was offered to Dr. Claassens as incentive during the recruitment negotiations with him in April 2005.

This agreement is to compensate RHC physicians for shouldering the burden of the extra patient load and on call duties if the other physician is away on leave or unable to fill his post, and when no locum is available to fill the vacancy.

Based on the above the RD acknowledges that Dr. Claassens accumulated 28 (Twenty Eight) days of administrative leave as the result of covering for Dr. James Toskas on three occasions during the last 7 months. This amounts to a total of 448 (four hundred and forty eight) hours of administrative leave.

Dr. Francois Claassens retains his right to take Annual leave or Administrative leave at his own discretion.

This agreement is automatically renewed with every yearly contract renewal with RHC.

LEAVE COVERAGE COMPENSATION**

AT A MEETING ON 2/03/2006, IT WAS AGREED THAT THE FOLLOWING POLICY OF LEAVE COVERAGE IN EFFECT SINCE 1998 WILL CONTINUE:

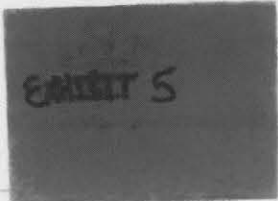
1. IN A CONTINUING POLICY, IN ORDER TO SAVE THE EXPENSES OF HIRING A LOCUM DOCTOR, THE STAFF MD'S WILL COVER EACH OTHERS LEAVE RATHER THAN UTILIZE A LOCUM DOCTOR, SAVING THE COST OF WAGES, MEALS, AIR TRANSPORTATION, GROUND TRANSPORTATION, HOUSING, ETC FOR A LOCUM REPLACEMENT DOCTOR
2. IN A CONTINUING POLICY, BECAUSE THE COVERING STAFF MD MUST DOUBLE HIS PATIENT LOAD AND CALL DAYS, COMPENSATION FOR THE STAFF DOCTOR COVERING THE DOCTOR ON LEAVE WILL BE TWO (2) DAYS OF ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE FOR EACH DAY OF EXTRA COVERAGE
3. AS HAS BEEN THE POLICY, ANY ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE NOT UTILIZED AT THE END OF A CONTRACT WILL BE CARRIED OVER TO A NEW CONTRACT OR ADDED ON AS A CONTRACT EXTENSION AS WAS DONE WITH DR. ROD KLASSEN.
4. THE MD'S WILL COORDINATE THIS LEAVE AND TAKE FULL RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE 24/7 MD COVERAGE OF RHC. THE ADMINISTRATIVE LEAVE WILL BE UTILIZED AT THE DOCTOR'S DISCRETION IN COORDINATION WITH THE OTHER STAFF MD.

MD LEAVE COVERAGE AGREEMENT

The coverage for an MD on leave is usually arranged with a locums MD. This arrangement involves costs for airline tickets, housing, and car rental, in addition to a salary. In the past, in order to avoid this cost for the CNMI and the difficulty of finding a locums MD today, the RHC MD's have agreed to cover each other's clinic and ER coverage during leave periods. The covering MD is then compensated with administrative leave for the extra hours of coverage. The agreement is 16 hours of administrative leave for a 24 hour ER shift. We agree to continue this policy to avoid the locum MD costs while providing MD coverage during an absence of a doctor.




