

TENTH SPECIAL SESSION, 1988

AN ACT

TO APPROVE THE COMMONWEALTH NONRESIDENT WORKER FEE FUND REVENUE PROJECTION AND TO APPROPRIATE THE RESERVES FOR THE OFFICES OF THE MAYORS OF ROTA, TINIAN AND AGUIGUAN, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND LABOR FOR FISCAL YEAR 1988 PURSUANT TO PUBLIC LAW 5-32.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

1 CHAPTER I. TITLE AND PURPOSE.

2 Section 101. Short Title. This Act may be cited as
3 "Public Law 5-32 Partial Appropriation Act of 1988."

4 Section 102. Purpose. The purpose of this Act is to
5 appropriate the Commonwealth Nonresident Worker Fee Fund
6 generated by Public Law 5-32 for the "Youth Employment
7 Training Program" with the offices of the Mayors of Rota and
8 Tinian and Aguiguan; and for the enforcement of Public Law
9 5-32 by the Department of Commerce and Labor for fiscal year
10 1988, ending on September 30, 1988.

11 CHAPTER II. APPROPRIATIONS.

12 Section 201. Estimated Fees. The legislature hereby
13 adopts and approves the estimated fees in the amount of
14 \$815,094.00 for fiscal year 1988 in accordance with Public
15 Law 5-32. This revenue identification is in compliance with
16 the Governor's authority under Amendment No. 14 to the
17 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Constitution.

1 Section 202. Items of Appropriation and Estimated
2 Surplus. Of the \$815,094 estimated fees collected and
3 generated under Public Law 5-32, the sum of \$110,000 is
4 hereby appropriated for the Youth Employment Training Program
5 with the offices of the Mayors of Rota, and Tinian and
6 Aguiguan and for the enforcement of Public Law 5-32 with the
7 Department of Commerce and Labor for fiscal year 1988. The
8 sum of \$609,099 is hereby appropriated for the Apprenticeship
9 Account under Public Law 6-4 for the Northern Marianas
10 College Vocational Education Program. Notwithstanding Public
11 Law 5-32, the estimated surplus for fiscal year 1988 under
12 the Commonwealth Nonresident Worker Fee Fund of \$95,995 is
13 hereby reserved and shall be available for future
14 appropriation for the Commonwealth Central Library on Saipan
15 when established.

14 CHAPTER III. ADMINISTRATION OF APPROPRIATED FUNDS

15 Section 301. Legislative Intent regarding the
16 Administrative Provisions. It is the intent of the Sixth
17 Northern Mariana Islands Commonwealth Legislature that the
18 administrative provisions and other provisions as set forth
19 in this Act shall not be subject to item veto by the Governor
20 pursuant to Article II, Section 7(a) of the Constitution of
21 the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, as amended.

22 Section 302. Administrative Guidelines. The
23 appropriations as specified in the appropriation worksheets
24 shall be expended in accordance with the following
25 administrative provisions:

26 (a) The funds allocated in each of the
27 appropriation worksheets shall be allotted one hundred

1 per cent (100%) to each office and by class code as
2 specified in the appropriation worksheet.

3 (b) The expenditure authority shall be as provided
4 under Public Law 5-32.

5 (c) Except for the Department of Commerce and
6 Labor, funds for the offices of the Mayors of Rota, and
7 Tinian and Aguiguan shall not be expended for permanent
8 positions or personnel.

9 (d) The offices of the Mayors of Rota, and Tinian
10 and Aguiguan are to determine a reasonable number of
11 positions needed in implementing the intend and
12 objective of the Youth Employment Training Program.
13 Positions created or established shall not be construed
14 nor used for employment of permanent positions or
15 personnel. These positions shall terminate upon
16 completion of the Youth Employment Training Program.

17 (e) The Youth Employment Training Program shall
18 commence from the month of June and shall end on August
19 of each year.

20 (f) The expenditure of funds for personnel shall
21 not be subject to the inclusions and the requirements
22 for personnel benefits such as the Northern Mariana
23 Islands Retirement Fund except for insurance coverage
24 for personal liabilities against the Commonwealth
25 Government.

26 (g) The Civil Service Commission Personnel
27 Regulations shall not be applicable to the hiring of

1 personnel for the offices of the Mayors of Rota, and
2 Tinian and Aguiguan. All hirings shall be ungraded
3 positions as provided in the appropriation worksheet.

4 (h) Lapsed and unexpended funds at the end of the
5 program or at the end of the fiscal year shall revert
6 back to the Commonwealth Nonresident Worker Fee Fund,
7 and shall be credited to the respective accounts for
8 Tinian, Rota, Department of Commerce and Labor, and the
9 Apprenticeship Account, to be used for future
10 appropriation to those accounts only for the specific
11 purposes set forth in this Act and Public Law 5-32.

12 (i) The Northern Marianas College, in consultation
13 and coordinaton with the Mayors of Rota and Tinian,
14 shall provide one or more classroom(s) and introductory
15 lectures on vocational training to the youths employed
16 under the Youth Employment Training Program.

17 Section 303. Amendment. Section 315 of Public Law 6-5
18 is amended as follows:

19 "(c) Lapsed funds, not to exceed \$24,000.00,
20 available from the vacant and new positions of the
21 Department of Public Safety may be used to pay Standby
22 Compensation."

23 Secton 304. Amendment. Fish and Wildlife Appropriation
24 Worksheet under Public Law 6-5. The amount of \$95,000.00
25 under Miscellaneous Services, Class Code 4290, shall be
26 expended as follows:
