AN ACT

To repeal P.L. 3-43 to conform to Constitutional Amendment No. 38; to provide for an elected Board of **Education**; to establish an autonomous education system in the Northern Marianas; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

7	Article 1. General Provisions.
8	Section 1501. Short Title. This Act may be cited
9	as the "Education Act of 1988."
10	Section 1502. <u>Declaration</u> .
11	(a) Every person within the Northern Mariana
12	Islands who is between the ages of six and sixteen has the
13	right to free public education.
14	(b) The Northern Marianas Legislature finds and
15	declares that every person shall have access to library
16	resources.
17	Section 1503. <u>Principles</u> . The public school system,
18	at pre-school, elementary and secondary levels, shall be
L9	established and organized by law and pursuant to
20	regulations issued by the Board or their authorized
21	designees. The Board shall establish the philosophy,
22	including goals and guiding principles, under which the
23	Public School System shall be organized. The Commissioner
24	is authorized by the Board to implement the philosophy,
25	goals and guiding principles of the Board.

	Section 1504, <u>Definitions</u> .
2	(a) "Board" means the Board of Education.
3	(b) "Public School System" means the public
4	education school system which shall serve as a State
5	Department of Education for pre-school, elementary and
6	secondary school programs.
7	(c) *Pre-school* means programs of instruction
8	for students either four or five years of age.
9	(d) *Elementary Education* means grades one
10	through seven.
11	(e) 'Secondary Education' means grades eight
12	through twelve.
13	(f) "Commissioner" means the Chief Executive
14	Officer of the Public School System as selected by the
15	Board of Education.
16	Article 2. Organization of Educational Services.
17	section 1520. Board of Education.
18	(a) There is hereby established a Board of
19	Education, consisting of five voting members elected
20	at-large on a non-partisan basis as follows: one from the
21	first senatorial district, one from the second senatorial
22	district, and three from the third senatorial district.
23	(b) The Governor shall appoint three non-voting
24	ex-officio members to the Board of Education as follows:
	one member shall be a representative of a non-public

- school; one member shall be a student attending a public
- secondary school, appointed on a rotating basis by
- 3 Senatorial precinct; and one member selected by an
- 4 exclusive bargaining process as a representative of the
- 5 teachers within the Public School System. These
- 6 appointees may be reappointed and shall serve at the
- 7 pleasure of the Governor.
- 8 (c) One elected member of the Board of
- 9 Education shall represent the Board of Education in the
- 10 Board of Regents for the Northern Marianas College. The
- Board of Education shall select the person to represent
- the Board in the Board of Regents. The representative
- from the Board of Education to the Board of Regents will
- 14 not be subject to approval by the Governor nor advice and
- consent by the Senate. No employee of the Board of Regents
- may represent the Board of Education in the Board of
- 17 Regents.
- 18 (d) Elected members of the Board shall serve
- terms of four years except that the terms of the first
- 20 members elected shall be determined by drawing of lots
- 21 with three members serving a term of four years and two
- members serving a term of two years. Appointed members
- shall serve for a term of four years, except for a student
- representative who shall be appointed for the duration of
- enrollment in a public school.

1 (e) Elected members of the Board shall serve commencing on the second Monday of January in the year 2 following the regular general election at which they were 3 elected. 4 (f) An elected member of the Board shall be 6 qualified to vote in the Commonwealth, be at least twenty-five years of age; and a resident and domiciliary of 7 the commonwealth for at least five years immediately 8 proceeding the date on which the member takes office. 9 No elected member of the Board shall be an employee of the 10 Public School System. An elected member shall reside in 11 the island or islands in which he or she is elected. 12 Pursuant to 1 CMC, Section 2264, members of 13 the Board may receive compensation for meetings actually 14 attended at a rate consistent with Commonwealth Law or 15 guidelines. A member who is employed by the Commonwealth 16 Legislature or any of the instrumentalities of the Common-17 wealth shall receive his or her regular salary under 18 19 administrative leave status in lieu of compensation for meetings held during working hours. A member traveling on 20 21 official business shall receive travel and per diem compensation at rates and guidelines established for the 22 public School System employees. All payments for 23 compensation of travel, and expenses to members of the 24 Board shall be paid by warrants signed by the Chairman of 25

1 the Board of Education. (h) Any vacancy on the Board caused by the 2 death, resignation, or removal of in appointed member 3 shall be filled in the same manner as the original 4 appointment to serve the unexpired term of that vacancy. 5 Upon a vacancy on the Board caused by the death, 6 resignation, or removal of an elected member, the Governor 7 shall appoint the candidate who received the next highest 8 number of votes in the same election and district where the former Board member was elected. If no candidate is 10 11 interested to fill the vacancy, the Governor shall appoint someone from that Senatorial District. Elected members who 12 are employed by the Public School System, shall resign from 13 their employment upon certification that they are a 14 candidate by the Board of Elections. 15 Section 1521. Board of Education: Meetings. 16 (a) Meetings of the Board will be open and held 17 at least once every 3 months. Special meetings shall be 18 called by the chairman or by a majority of the Board 19 members as often as may be necessary for the transaction 20

at least once every 3 months. Special meetings shall be
called by the chairman or by a majority of the Board
members as often as may be necessary for the transaction
of the Public School System's business. All regular
meetings shall be open, except when personal matters
affecting the privacy of an individual are considered.
The Board may, on its own initiative or at the request of
the individual involved, consider such matters in closed

session; however, any official action resulting therefrom

shall be acted upon in an open meeting.

3 (b) A chairman shall be elected by a majority 4 vote of the voting members of the Board.

5 (c) All actions of the Board requiring a vote
6 shall be conducted at a board meeting. The presence of 4
7 voting members shall constitute a quorum for transaction
8 of business at any Board meeting. All actions of the Board
9 requiring a vote, requires the concurrence of 3 of the
10 voting members; except for the removal of Board members as

11 provided in subsection "f" of this Section.

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(d) EX-officio members of the Board are permitted to vote only in the Standing Committees or other special committees established by the Board.

(e) In the absence of a quorum where the Board has the responsibility to act, or in the absence of Board policy, the commissioner shall have the authority and responsibility to take appropriate action, subject to the review by the Board.

(f) A Board member shall be removed by the concurrence of 3 of the voting Board members for conviction of a felony, corruption, neglect of duty, mental or physical incapacitation; provided, for the neglect of duty, a Board member may be removed by concurrence of 4 of the voting members.

- 4 Section 1523. Public School System. There is hereby
- 5 established as a non-profit corporation, the Public school
- 6 System which shall be the state education agency for

- 8 school System shall be headed by an elected board to be

- Section 1524. Commissioner of Education:

- 12 (a) The Board shall formulate policies and

6	Carolinian and shall be disseminated throughout the public
7	schools and media. Interested persons shall be given a
8	reasonable opportunity to express their views on the
9	formation or reorganization of the attendance district
10	before the Board makes its decision regarding such
11	formation or reorganization.
12	(c) Except as provided in this Section, every
13	public school student shall attend a public school in the
14	attendance district in which his parent(s) or legal
15	guardian resides except for special education students.

2	Section 1526. <u>Interagency Cooperation</u> . The Board of
3	Regents and other instrumentalities of the Commonwealth

6	operation of the programs of the Public School System.
7	Section 1527. <u>Libraries</u> .
8	(a) There is established within the Public
9	school system a Commonwealth Library under the
10	administrative authority of the Commissioner of Education.
11	The Commonwealth Library System shall consist of public
12	and private school libraries.
13	(b) The Commonwealth Librarian shall:
14	(1) Have control over all public library
15	materials of the Commonwealth unless otherwise
16	provided for by law;
17	(2) Purchase books and other library
18	materials;
19	(3) If so designated by the Board, be
20	authorized to accept by gifts, devise or
21	bequest, any funds or other property from
22	public and non-public sources and to dispose
23	of such property for the benefit of the

16	Education, shall establish and provide such academic and
17	vocational educational programs as are appropriate and
18	beneficial to the students and which shall serve the needs
19	of the community.
20	(b) The Board shall adopt programs to insure
21	that all handicapped students have available to them free,
22	appropriate public education designed to meet their unique
23	needs and to insure that the rights of handicapped students
24	and their parents or guardians are protected. The program
25	shall provide a procedure to ensure the on-going

identification, diagnosis, and education of physically, 1 cognitively and emotionally handicapped students in the 2 least restrictive environment. 3 section 1532. Student Records: Right to Access. Immunizations . 6 Every parent of a child shall, at the time 7 of first enrollment of the child in any Commonwealth special education, pre-school, elementary, or secondary 8 9 school, public or non-public, irrespective of grade level, provide the school authorities with proof that the child 10 has received all of the immunizations required by the 11 12 Department of Public Health and Environmental Services. If the child has not received all of the required 13 14 immunizations, the parents shall be notified immediately 15 that they are required to initiate all required 16 immunizations for their child within 2 weeks after the date of such notice. Every parent of a child already 17 enrolled in a commonwealth School, public or non-public, 18 whose child's health records show incomplete 19 20 immunizations, shall be required to initiate remedial action within 2 weeks following notification of the 21 immunization of the deficiency. Except as provided in 22 Section 1562 of this Act, failure to comply shall be 23 grounds for suspension of the child from school until 24 immunization standards have been met. 25

Section 1570. (a) Any person or institution desiring to establish or to operate a non-public school or educational program within the Commonwealth for pre-school, elementary, or secondary, shall submit an application for a charter to

be approved and issued by the Board.

- (b) The application shall contain the name of the applicant, the proposed location of the school or program, the proposed language and course of instruction, a summary of the financing of the school or program, and such other pertinent and necessary information as may be required by the Board.
 - (c) The applicant shall satisfy the Board that the proposed school or program meets standards of the commonwealth for curriculum, building safety, health, sanitation, and any other applicable standards that may be required by the Commonwealth or Board.
- (d) The Board shall have no more than three months from date of receipt of the application to approve or disapprove a charter. The school or program shall be monitored by the **Commissioner** to ensure the school or program is complying with its charter.

1	(e) The Board, after notice and opportunity for
2	hearing, may suspend or revoke the charter of any
3	non-public schooi if in its judgement the holder nas
4	violated the terms of the charter or is otherwise not
5	providing the education required by its charter.
6	section 1571. Government Assistance to Chartered
7	on-public Schools. The Commissioner will establish
8	guidelines to be endorsed by the Board which will
9.	establish the types of services to be provided to
10	non-public school students provided that such assistance
11	will not be in conflict with existing laws of the
12	commonwealth and will not infringe on the delivery of

1	Section 1582. Certificates: Revocation.
2	(a) The 30ard may revoke any certificate after
3	issuance thereof when the holder has committed a material
4	deception or fraud on his application. Any person
5	committing such material deception or fraud shall be
6	quilty of a violation of this section, and upon conviction
7	shall be fined not more-than 100 dollars.
8	(b) The Board shall adopt and issue rules and
9	regulations concerning the duties and discipline of
10	certified personnel within ninety days after this Act
11	becomes effective.
12	(c) The Board may revoke or suspend the holder'
13	certificate for immoral conduct, unprofessional conduct,
14	incompetency, or for defiance of and refusal to obey the
15	rules, regulations and laws governing the duties of
16	certified personnel. The Board will review suspension
17	actions on a case by case basis.
18	(d) Whenever the holder of a certificate has
19	been convicted of any criminal offense, the Board shall
20	suspend the holder's certificate.
21	(e) Prior to suspending or revoking any such
22	certificate, the Board shall give the holder 20 days
23	notice of proposed action specifying the reason therefore,
24	and provide such holder an opportunity for a hearing
25	wherein such holder shall have the right to be represented

1	by counsel, cross-examine witnesses and produce testimony
2	on his behalf. Within 20 days after the Board's final
3	decision, such holder may appeal to the Commonwealth Trial
4	court, and the standard for judicial review shall be
5	whether such decision is supported by substantial evidence
6	on the record made before the Board, taken as a whole, and
7	the facts in question shall not be subject to trial de
8	novo .

11	Transfer of Funds.
12	(a) The Director of Finance shall, on a monthly
13	basis, disburse funds to the Public School System subject
14	to their having been appropriated by the Legislature.
