## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Section 3 of Public Law 6-13 to allow the use of submerged lands for the purpose of the Saipan Commercial Port Expansion and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

	1	Section 1.	Findings	and	Purpose.
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- (a) The Legislature finds that under the provisions of the Submerged Lands Act (Public Law 6-13, Section 3(c)) the use of submerged lands in the Saipan Commercial Port Expansion to be undertaken by the Commonwealth Ports Authority is subject to prior Legislative approval. Further, the Commonwealth Ports Authority, as an applicant for a permit to use submerged lands, is required to finance the cost of a coastal engineering plan and an environmental protection plan, which plans determine the environmental feasibility of the project and the terms and conditions under which a permit will be issued.
- 14 (b) However, the Legislature finds that both the
  15 United States Army Corps of Engineers and the
  16 Commonwealth Coastal Resource Managing Agencies in
  17 consultation with the United States Environmental
  18 Protection Agency, the United States Fish and Wildlife
  19 Service, the National Marine Fisheries Service and the

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Division of Fish and Wildlife of the Commonwealth
Department of Natural Resources have already
considered the environmental issues involved in the
dredging, landfilling, dock construction and sewer
outfall relocation which will take place as part of
the expansion and have issued permits specifying the
appropriate terms and conditions under which the work
may proceed.

- (c) The Legislature finds, too, that the Saipan Commercial Port Expansion is of utmost importance to the continued economic health of the Commonwealth, that the project is funded, and that the commencement of bidding is imminent.
- (d) Therefore, it is the purpose of this Act to exempt the Commonwealth Ports Authority Saipan

  Commercial Port Expansion project from the normal permitting procedures required under the Submerged Lands Act.
- (e) The Legislature also finds that due to the improvement to Smiling Cove Marina being carried out by the Commonwealth Department of Natural Resources, a need exists for temporary, alternative mooring and docking facilities for small Craft.
- (f) A second purpose of this Act is to allow the Department of Natural Resources to designate such

1	mooring and docking areas as are needed while the
2	Smiling Cove Marina is under reconstruction without
3	further requirement.
4	Section 2. Addition; Redesignation.
5	(a) A new subsection (c) is added to Section 3
6	of Public Law 6-13 to read as follows:
7	"(c) The Legislature expressly approves the
8	use of Commonwealth submerged lands for the Saipan
9	Commercial Port Expansion project to the extent
10	approved by and under the same terms and condition
11	specified in the United States Army Corps of
12	Engineers Permit Number PODCO-0 1992-SD and the
13	Commonwealth Coastal Resources Managing Agencies
14	Coastal Permit Decision SMS-87-X-36 (Attachments
15	"A" and "B" of this Act, respectively). No public
16	hearing shall be required under the terms of this
17	Act prior to implementation of this project.
18	"In the event that detonation of ordnance or
19	other activity, having the potential to injure
20	marine resources and not addressed or foreseen in
21	the Army Corps of Engineers Permit or Coastal
22	Permit Decision, is required as part of the
23	project, the Commonwealth Division of Fish and
24	Wildlife shall establish the terms and conditions
25	under which such detonation or other activity shal

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1	be permitted."				
2	(b) Subsection (c) of Section 3 of Public Law 6-13				
3	is redesignated as subsection (d) accordingly.				
4	(c) A new subsection (a)(4) is added to Section 3				
5	of Public Law 6-13 to read as follows:				
6	"(4) The Director of the Department of Natura				
7	Resources shall designate alternative mooring and				
8	docking sites for the use of small craft				
9	temporarily displaced by the Smiling Cove Marina				
10	Project specified in (1) of this subsection."				
11	Section 4. <u>Effective Date.</u> This Act shall take effect				
12	upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law				
13	without such approval.
