H. B. 17-172

AN ACT

TO PRESERVE AND DESIGNATE ONE HECTARE OF PUBLIC LAND ON THE ISLAND OF BOTA FOR THE FUTURE SITE OF THE ROTA VETERANS CEMETERY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

The Bill was referred to the House Committee on Natural Resources, which submitted Standing Committee Report 17-78, which was adopted on May 12, 2011.

The Bill was not referred to a Senate Committee. THE BILL WAS PASSED BY THE SENATE ON FIRST AND FINAL READING, OCTOBER 5, 2011; without amendments.

AN ACT

TO PRESERVE AND DESIGNATE ONE HECTABE OF PUBLIC LAND ON THE ISLAND OF ROTA FOR THE FUTURE SITE OF THE ROTA VETERANS CEMETERY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Seventeenth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature:

Section 1. <u>Short Title.</u> This Act may be cited as the "Rota Veterans
Cemetery Designation Act of 2011".

Section 2. <u>Findings</u>. The Legislature finds that the Commonwealth received a Veterans Cemetery Construction Project Grant in the amount of \$1,666,980 from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs in August 2005 for the construction of a CNMI Veterans Cemetery on Saipan. The CNMI Veterans Cemetery construction commenced in September 2005 and the cemetery was opened on November 11, 2006 in Marpi, Saipan. The cemetery is owned and operated by the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

PUBLIC LAW NO. 17-60 **HOUSE BILL 17-172**

The Legislature finds that the people and veterans from the island of Rota 2 have expressed their desire to have a veterans cemetery on the island of Rota. Once a loved one is buried at the Veteran's Cemetery on Saipan, it becomes 4 extremely difficult for family members and loved ones to visit the burial site because many are unable to afford the exorbitant airline fare, car rental, food and 6 other expenses incurred when waveling to Saipan. The financial burden that is placed on each member of the bereaved family is too burdensome during their 8 time of loss coupled with the current financial difficulty many of our people face 9 today because of our ailing economy. During the death of a loved one, 0 traditionally, family members visit the burial site frequently after they are buried. All Souls' Day and All Saints' Day are also waditionally spent at the burial sites 2 of loved ones and is practiced every year. With the CNMI Veterans Cemetery 3 located a plane ride away, many families cannot continue this tradition.

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The Legislature further finds that Rota has lost and buried several Vietnam Veterans and those who were deployed to Iraq at its existing cemetery. As a result, this would justify the need to create and establish a veterans cemetery on the island of Rota. The Rota Veterans Cemetery may inter any eligible veteran, along with spouses and eligible dependents. Therefore, this legislative body empathizes with the people of Rota and is in accord with the intentions of this bill.

Section 3. Designation of Veterans Cemetery. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Department of Public Lands shall designate

one hectare of feasible public land on the island of Rota to be preserved and designated as the future site of the Rota Veterans Cemetery.

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Section 4. <u>Severability</u>. If any provisions of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

8 Section 5. <u>Savings Clause</u>. This Act and any repealer contained herein 9 shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or 10 acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted 11 under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding 12 instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have 13 the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, 14 which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.
