#### AN ACT

To amend 1 CMC § 1610(a); to permit youth congress sessions every two months.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE TWENTIETH NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

**Section 1. Findings and Purpose.** The Legislature finds that Public Law 8-27 established the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Youth Congress under the administrative supervision of the Legislative Bureau of the Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature. Establishment of the Youth Congress was to provide a system of government granting political exposure to our youth about the duties and responsibilities of the legislative process.

The Legislature further finds that as future leaders of the Commonwealth, the Youth Congress is empowered to make its own rules, establish committees, hold hearings, pass resolutions, prepare and pass bills, which is then forwarded to the Governor and the presiding officers of the Legislature for disposition.

The Legislature further finds that as the members of the Youth Congress address concerns, aspirations, and desires within our youth community that they be recognized for taking an active role in introducing legislation to represent our youth as future leaders of the Commonwealth.

The Legislature further finds that on January 20, 2018, the Sixteenth Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands Youth Congress convened in an open and public session to entertain legislative business of the youth. At the session, Youth Congress Bill No. 16-02, entitled, *To amend 1 CMC § 1610(a); and for other purposes*, was passed

by the members present.

The Legislature further finds that based on the findings stated in Youth Congress Bill No. 16-02, that the Youth Congress currently convenes for a total of four regular sessions within a year, except for special sessions. The limitation of regular sessions hinders the responsibilities of the members of the Youth Congress in introducing and entertaining legislation and resolutions to address the pressing issues facing our youth in the CNMI.

Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to adhere to the intent of Youth Congress Bill No, 16-02, by amending 1 CMC § 1610 (a) to increase the number of sessions from four regular sessions to six which will permit the Youth Congress to have a regular session every two months rather than every three months.

**Section 2.** Amendment. 1 CMC § 1610 (a) is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(a) Regular sessions of the youth congress shall may be held every three two months on the third Saturday of the month, exclusive of holidays, for one day, commencing the third Saturday in April. Additional session days, but not more than three days, are permitted each year."

**Section 3.** Severability. If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 4. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation, or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

**Section 5.** Effective Date. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or becoming law without such approval.
