PUBLIC NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF AND AMENDMENT TO MIAA RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Mariana Islands Airport Authority, pursuant to the authority of Section 4(4) Public Law No. 6-58, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 4(1) of Title 17 of the Trust Territory Code, hereby gives notice to the public of its intention to adopt new regulations and amend existing regulations for the Mariana Islands Airport Authority concerning the following: power-in and push-out of aircraft; running of engines during operations; and landing and enplaned passenger charges. The proposed regulations are published herewith.

All interested persons will be given a reasonable opportunity to submit data, views, or arguments, in writing, concerning the proposal regulations. Written comments must be submitted to the Executive Director, Mariana Islands Airport Authority, not later than the close of business thirty (30) calendar days following the date of publication of this Notice.

If no comments have been received at the expiration of the Notice period provided for herein, the said Regulations shall become effective without further notice or publication.

AMENDMENT TO RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Part 6 of the Rules and Regulations of the Mariana Islands Airport Authority is hereby amended by the addition of a new Part 6.6, to read as follows:
 - "6.6 Power-in, push-out of aircraft.
 - "(a) All jet aircraft parking anywhere on the apron at Saipan International Airport shall be permitted to power-in, but must be pushed or towed out upon departure.
 - "(b) It is recognized that some models of jet aircraft require starting of engines prior to push-out due to lack of an internal APU. In such cases, the push-out requirement of Paragraph (a) of this Part 6.6 shall not apply; however, in such cases, such aircraft shall be towed or pushed out to a safe distance away from the terminal and from other aircraft before breakaway jet engine power is applied.
 - "(c) Subject to the provisions of Part 3.4 of these Rules and Regulations, the Executive Director may make exceptions to the requirements of this Part when he determines that power-out operations will not pose a hazard to other operations or aircraft upon the apron, and will not pose a hazard, inconvenience, or discomfort to passengers in the departure area of the terminal or in the process of boarding or deboarding another aircraft. However, no exception to this Part may be granted by the Executive Director when more than one jet aircraft is on the apron at any one time."
- 2. Part 6 of the Rules and Regulations of the Mariana Islands Airport Authority is hereby further amended by the addition of a new Part 6.7 to read as follows:

"6.6 Running of engines during operations.

No propeller-driven aircraft engine shall be operated while such aircraft is parked on the ramp for the purpose of or during the loading or unloading of passengers or cargo, unless (1) a duly authorized agent of the operator of the aircraft is present during such loading or unloading, and shall take all necessary steps to assure the safety of passengers and other persons upon the ramp; and (2) the operator of such aircraft shall have deposited with the Authority a certificate or other evidence of insurance, in a form and upon a company satiafactory to the Authority, insuring the operator, the Auhority, and their respective agents, employees, and officers, against the risks of personal injury, loss of life, and property damage in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 for each person, \$3,000,000 for each incident, and \$100,000 for property damage."

- 3. Part 12(b) of the Rules and Regulations of the Mariana Islands Airport Authority is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "(b) Until otherwise determined by the Authority, the fees and charges set forth in this part shall apply, except that (i) the landing fees provided in Part 12.1 shall be fifty-five cents (55¢) per thousand (1,000) pounds gross certified landing weight of the aircraft as determined by the FAA for said aircraft, with a minimum fee of five dollars (\$5.00) per landing, for each landing at Saipan International Airport, Rota International Airport, and West Tinian International Airport; and (ii) the departure facility service charge provided in Part 12.3 shall be three dollars and fifty cents (\$3.50) per enplaned revenue passenger at Saipan International Airport, Rota International Airport, and West Tinian International Airport."



AMENDMENT NO. 1

PART 10.252. TAX ON WAGES AND SALARIES

Section 9. Income Derived from Sources Within and Without the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI).

- (a) In determining whether earned income is derived from sources within or without CNMI, the place where services are performed and not the place and manner of payment, controls. The only exception to the above will be the treatment of individuals employed within the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands who had income earned while on TDY or official business travel outside the tax jurisdiction of the Commonwealth Government. Such income shall be treated as income earned within the CNMI and subject to the provisions of the local tax rate pursuant to Public Law No. 1-30.
- (b) Employees who are physically working in the CNMI but wages and salaries are funded by sources from outside the CNMI will be treated as income earned within the CNMI and subject to the provisions of local tax rate pursuant to Public Law No. 1-30.
- (c) Both sub-sections (a) and (b) will be entitled to the 100% rebate provisions of the Territorial Income Tax pursuant to Chapter II, Section 1, of Public Law No. 1-30, provided that, the treatment of income carned while outside the tax jurisdiction of the Commonwealth Government as set forth in paragraph (a) shall be applied only to income earned during any 90-day period during the taxable year. Said 90 days are working days, and need not be consecutive.

(d) Any other questions otherwise not covered by these regulations will be resolved based on the interpretation, definition and precedent established in the Internal Revenue Code, Section 935, Title 26 of the United States Code.
