

TITLE 6: CRIMES AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
DIVISION 1: CRIMES AGAINST THE PERSON

§ 1803. Criminal Mischief.

(a) A person commits the offense of criminal mischief if he or she intentionally or knowingly:

(1) Causes another, by deception or threat, to suffer pecuniary or property loss;

(2) Tamper with property of another thereby causing a danger to person or property or causing a substantial interruption or impairment of public communication, transportation, supply of water, power or other public service; or

(3) Intentionally discards waste, debris or trash upon land of another or upon any public land not designated as a disposal site.

(b) A person convicted under this section may be punished by imprisonment for not more than six months, a fine of not more than \$1,000 and at least 40 hours of community service.
