

TITLE 6: CRIMES AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
GENERAL PROVISIONS

§ 302. Solicitation.

(a) A person commits the offense of solicitation, if, with intent to promote or facilitate the commission of an offense, that person commands, encourages, or requests another person to engage in the acts or cause the result specified by the definition of the offense, or engages in conduct which would establish complicity in the specified conduct or result.

(b) It is immaterial under subsection (a) of this section that the defendant fails to communicate with the person he or she solicits if the defendant's conduct was designed to cause such communication.

(c) It is an affirmative defense to prosecution for solicitation that the defendant, under circumstances showing a complete and voluntary renunciation of criminal intent, made a reasonable effort to prevent the conduct or result solicited.
