

TITLE 6: CRIMES AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE
DIVISION 3 : MISCELLANEOUS OFFENSES

§ 3183. Violations and Penalties.

(a) A person who smokes in an area where smoking is prohibited by the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a civil infraction, punishable by:

(1) A fine not to exceed fifty dollars for a first violation.

(2) A fine not to exceed one hundred dollars for a second violation.

(3) A fine not to exceed two hundred dollars for a third and subsequent violation and the completion of a mandatory tobacco prevention and/or cessation course.

(b) A person who owns, manages, operates, or otherwise controls a public place or place of employment and who fails to comply with the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a civil infraction, punishable by:

(1) A fine not to exceed two hundred dollars for a first violation.

(2) A fine not to exceed three hundred dollars for a second violation within one year.

(3) A fine not exceeding five hundred dollars for each additional violation within one year.

(c) In addition to the fines established by this section, violation of this article by a person who owns, manages, operates, or otherwise controls a public place or place of employment may result in the suspension or revocation of any business license issued to the person for the premises on which the violation occurred.

(d) Each day in which a violation of this article occurs shall be considered a separate and distinct violation.
