DIVISION 3: MISCELLANEOUS OFFENSES

§ 3504. Crime of Terrorism.

(a) A person is guilty of a crime of terrorism when, with intent to intimidate or coerce a civilian population, influence the policy of a unit of government by intimidation or coercion, or affect the conduct of a unit of government by murder, assassination or kidnapping, he or she commits a specified offense.

(b) A person convicted under this section may be punished by life imprisonment without parole for the offense of murder as defined in 6 CMC § 1101.

(c) A person convicted under this section may be punished by imprisonment of not more than fifteen years for any sexual offense as defined in 6 CMC § 1301 et seq. and kidnapping as defined in 6 CMC § 1421 or by life imprisonment without parole for the offense of kidnapping if the person committing the offense voluntarily releases the victim alive and uninjured and in a safe place prior to trial.

(d) A person convicted under this section may be punished by imprisonment of not more than ten years for all other specified offenses.
