## TITLE 6: CRIMES AND CRIMINAL PROCEDURE DIVISION 4: DISPOSITION OF OFFENDERS

## § 4101. Fines.

A person who has been convicted of any offense under this title, unless a fine is elsewhere prescribed by law, in addition to any other punishment authorized by law, may be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding:

- (a) \$10,000 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of 10 years imprisonment;
- (b) \$5,000 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of five years imprisonment;
- (c) \$1,000 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of one year imprisonment;
- (d) \$500 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of six months imprisonment;
- (e) \$50 when the conviction is for an offense punishable by a maximum of 30 days imprisonment;
- (f) Any higher amount equal to double the pecuniary gain obtained from the offense by the defendant; or
  - (g) Any higher amount specifically authorized by statute.
