§ 2902. Chamorro Custom: Ancestors' Land.

Ancestors' land passes in intestacy in the following manner:

- (a) The surviving spouse obtains a life estate, with the issue obtaining a vested remainder in fee simple by representation.
- (b) If there is no surviving spouse, the surviving issue of the decedent obtain all of the properties by representation.
- (c) If there is no issue, the surviving spouse obtains a life estate, with the remainder to the decedent's siblings, or if they are not living, to their issue, by representation.
- (d) If the decedent is unmarried and without issue at the time of death, decedent's land passes to his siblings, or if they are not living, to their issue by representation.
