Dear Mr. Chairman and Mr. Speaker:

This is to inform you that I have signed into law **House Local Bill No. 23-48, D1,** entitled, "To appropriate \$51,017.00 for the personnel and operations of the Tinian Casino Gaming Control Commission and the Office of the Mayor of Tinian & Aguiguan pursuant to 10 CMC § 2581 and 1 CMC § 1405," which was passed by the Tinian and Aguiguan Legislative Delegation of the Twenty-Third Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature.

Notwithstanding my signature, I have disapproved the following parts of the enactment for the following reasons:

Vetoed - Page 2 Line 5

Based on the opinion of the Attorney General, I will line-item veto the appropriation of \$10,000 to the Mayor's Discretionary Account, as the language of the local bill fails to describe a public purpose of the appropriation to the Discretionary Account that falls within the scope of 10 CMC § 2581(a).

That statute provides that "all license fees and gambling revenue taxes generated by casinos in the Second Senatorial District (Tinian) shall be local revenues and shall be available for appropriation by the Tinian Legislative Delegation *for local public purposes*." (emphasis added).

The statute further provides that

An appropriation for local public purposes may include but is not limited to assistance in education, programs for youth and elderly development, scholarship, full time employees, medical referral, agricultural and fisheries development, cultural programs, community and recreational development, programs for special needs individuals, disabled and disadvantaged individuals, medical and dental insurance assistance, provided that such payment is limited to contributions made by the Commission to secure appropriate insurance coverage for Tinian Municipal government employees, and assistance to law enforcement.

HLB No. 23-48 provides that the appropriation to the Tinian Casino Gaming Control Commission is for personnel and operations, which is a permissible local public purpose under the statute. But because the bill does not specify the local public purpose of the appropriation for the Mayor's Discretionary Account, I respectfully exercise my constitutional authority to line-item veto this provision.

Vetoed - Page 2 Lines 9 and 10

I will likewise line-item veto the provision for the Mayor of Tinian and Aguiguan to be the expenditure authority for these funds, on the same grounds.

With the exception of the vetoed portions, this bill becomes **Tinian Local Law No. 23-13**. Copies bearing my signature are forwarded for your reference.

A LOCAL APPROPRIATION BILL FOR AN ACT FOR THE SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT

To appropriate \$51,017.00 for the personnel and operations of the Tinian Casino Gaming Control Commission and the Office of the Mayor of Tinian & Aguiguan pursuant to 10 CMC § 2581 and 1 CMC § 1405.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT DELEGATION PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 4, DIVISION 1, TITLE 1 OF THE COMMONWEALTH CODE:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE.

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The purpose of this Act is to appropriate Fifty-One Thousand Seventeen dollars (\$51,017.00 USD) generated from local revenue pursuant to 10 CMC § 2581 for the personnel and operations of the Tinian Casino Gaming Control Commission and the Mayor of Tinian & Aguiguan. The certification of funds was prepared on April 16, 2024, and was reviewed and confirmed by the Tinian Municipal Treasurer.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONS.

Notwithstanding any provision(s) of law, statutes, rules or regulations to the contrary and pursuant to funds allocated to the Second Senatorial District from local revenue, the Tinian and

Aguiguan Legislative Delegation hereby appropriates \$51,017.00 of the revenues collected for the Second Senatorial District as follows:

(A)\$41,017.00 to the Tinian Casino Gaming Control Commission for personnel and

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(B) \$10,000.00 to the Mayor's Discretionary Account.

SECTION 3. EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY.

operations expenses.

(A) The expenditure authority for funds under Section 2(A) shall be the Chairman of Tinian Casino Gaming Control Commission.

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(B) The expenditure authority for the funds under Section 2(D) shall be the Mayor of

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Tinian & Aguiguan.

SECTION 4. REPROGRAMMING.

Funds appropriated under this act shall not be reprogrammed for any other purpose and notwithstanding any provision of law, all funds appropriated under this Act shall be without fiscal year limitation(s).

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.

If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 6. SAVINGS CLAUSE.

This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing

right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of the Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability, civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence on the date this Act becomes effective.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.

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This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or it becoming law without such approval.
