ANACT

TO AMEND 1 CMC §7406(A)(4) BY INCLUDING THE ALCOHOL BEVERAGE AND TOBACCO CONTROL (ABTC) DIVISION'S VEHICLES IN THE DEFINITION OF "LAW ENFORCEMENT VEHICLE".

Be it enacted by the Twentieth Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature:

Section 1. Findings and Purpose. The Legislature finds that the Alcohol Beverage and Tobacco Control (ABTC) Division, under the Department of Commerce, is responsible for enforcing laws pertaining to alcoholic beverages and tobacco. Similar to the Department of Public Safety (DPS) and the Division of Customs, the ABTC Division consists of enforcement officers to carry out such enforcement. By including the ABTC Division's vehicles in the definition of "law enforcement vehicle", the ABTC Division vehicles will be awarded the same rights and privileges as DPS and Division of Customs vehicles in order to carry out their duties and responsibilities more efficiently.

The Legislature also finds that under 1 CMC §7406(a)(5), which is the definition of "Unmarked law enforcement vehicle", DPS and the Division of Customs are allowed possess unmarked law enforcement vehicles, which will enhable them to apprehend criminals and enforce the laws more efficiently. Similar to DPS and the Division of Customs, the ABTC

Division is allowed to conduct undercover operations. The only difference is that the ABTC Division is not allowed to have unmarked law enforcement vehicles. By amending 1 CMC §7406(a)(4), the ABTC Division will be afforded the opportunity to possess unmarked law enforcement vehicles and allow for them to conduct their operations more efficiently.

Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to amend 1 CMC §7406(a)(4) by including the Alcohol Beverage and Tobacco Control (ABTC) Division's vehicles in the definition of "Law enforcement vehicle".

Section 2. Amendment. 1 CMC §7406(a)(4) is hereby amended to read as follows:

"(4) "Law enforcement vehicle" means police cars and other such government vehicles operated by the Department of Public Safety, Alcohol Beverage and Tobacco Control (ABTC) Division, or Division of Customs and used primarily for the enforcement of Commonwealth or federal laws and regulations.

Section 3. <u>Severability.</u> If any provision of this Act or the application of any such provision to any person or circumstance should be held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Act or the application of its provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

Section 4. Savings Clause. This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence at the date this Act becomes effective.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date</u>. This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law without such approval.
