Dear Mr. Speaker and Mr. President:

This is to inform you that I have signed into law, with the exception of several disapproved sections, **House Bill 22-116**, **HD2**, **SS1**, **CCS1** entitled, "to make appropriations for the operations and activities of the Government of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, its agencies, instrumentalities, and independent programs, and to provide budget authority for government corporations for Fiscal Year 2023; and for other purposes," which was passed by the Twenty-Second Northern Marianas Commonwealth Legislature.

Pursuant to Section IX(a) of Article III of the N.M.I Constitution and 1 CMC § 7205(a), as Governor, I am required to submit a proposed balanced budget to the Legislature for the following year Fiscal Year by April 1st. In turn, the Legislature must set a limit on expenditures by October 1st. If no budget is passed by the first day of the fiscal year, the Government must effectively shut down and no funds may be expended from the General Fund, except to provide for essential services.

Whereas I have approved this measure into law, I am obliged to address several sections of this legislation of which I have found to be unclear, ambiguous, or problematic either in their inconsistencies with existing provisions of Commonwealth or Federal law or in their implementation's imposition of additional and unnecessary steps that would delay governmental efficiency.

Moreover, I take this opportunity to express my utter disappointment in the House Majority Leadership's failure to expeditiously pass this Budget bill for Fiscal Year 2023 which has unnecessarily caused many government employees concern and worry. Additionally, I commend the members of the Senate for passing their version of the Budget bill in a timely manner in order

to safeguard our government employees' jobs and livelihoods. I also want to thank the Senate for their decision to adhere to our existing ARPA spending plan which was submitted and approved by our federal partners. Furthermore, I thank the House Majority for their understanding and acceptance of the ARPA requirements and its limitations with regard to spending mandates and authorities.

I would also like to take this opportunity to ensure our community members that my Administration has never had issues with meeting our Medicaid obligations in the past, and that we have always allocated funding to support our Medicaid recipients in the right way. Similarly, my Administration has always and will continue to safeguard our retirees' pensions as is our responsibility to our Man'amko. I thank our community and especially our government employees for their patience in the passage of this important legislation.

Please find my comments and actions on specific provisions as follows:

COMMENTS ON APPROVED PARTS OF THE ENACTMENT

Section 603

This provision maintains the status quo that exists for Residents Department Heads with regard to their annual salaries and allows for the adjustment of the Resident Deputy Commissioners of the Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services for the islands of Rota and Tinian to be fairly compensated.

VETOED PARTS OF THE ENACTMENT

Section 404

This provision sought to require the respective mayors of the First and Second Senatorial Districts to use Purchase cards issued through E-procurement to pay outstanding vendor billings in a timely manner. This mandate conflicts with existing procurement regulations and processes already in place. Due to its restrictive language, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision in its entirety.*

Section 602 (a)

This provision is problematic because it limits the Executive Branch's ability to hire employees, especially in the beginning of a new Fiscal Year. This restriction would burden the Executive Branch's ability to carry out its mandates and functions when positions within the Executive Branch need to be filled. For this reason, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision in its entirety.*

Section 602 (b)

This language in this provision is vague and ambiguous, thus, has the potential to delay and bring forth unnecessary hiring burdens onto government departments or agencies when seeking to fill vacant positions. As such, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision in its entirety.*

Section 703 (b)

This provision provides that "[n]otwithstanding 1 CMC § 7204, without prior legislative approval, no funds appropriated to the Judicial Branch may be reduced." If estimated revenue is less than what is projected, the Secretary of Finance may reduce appropriations so that such decreases are absorbed proportionately across all three branches of government. This requirement circumvents constitutional processes for enacting laws and violates the separation of powers doctrine. Thus, *I must respectfully veto this provision*.

Section 703 (c)

The last sentence of this provision conflicts with existing provisions of law and hinders the government's ability to make necessary adjustments in cases of emergency. Therefore, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision*.

Section 704 (a)

Similar to Section 703 (b), this provision becomes problematic if estimated revenue is less than what is projected. For this reason, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision*.

Section 704 (c)

Again, analogous to Section 703(c), this provision conflicts with existing provisions of law and hinders the government's ability to make necessary adjustments in cases of emergency. Due to its conflicting language, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision*.

Section 712

Section (a) requires all expenditure authorities to submit quarterly fund status reports to the presiding officers of the Legislature quarterly. Failure to submit reports would result in the suspension of government entities' future allocations. This requirement is unnecessary and redundant as the Secretary of Finance is already statutorily mandated under the Planning and Budgeting Act to report fund statuses 30 days after the end of each quarter.

Further, pertaining to Section 712 (b), access to the Munis Financial Management Information System and other financial and accounting systems must be limited only to authorized users within the Department of Finance to protect Taxpayer Confidentiality. Reports and fund status may be obtained directly from the Secretary of the Department of Finance as mandated in Section 203 of this bill. My Administration supports the Department of Finance's authorizing of access of the new system to designated users within Legislative Branch for all matters pertaining to legislative expenditures. Again, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision*.

Section 713

This provision unnecessarily addresses remedies for violations of spending limits already provided by The Planning and Budgeting Act. For this reason, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision*.

Section 801(a)

This provision is ambiguous and likely a typographical error. For this reason, *I must respectfully* exercise my authority to veto this provision.

Section 801 (d)

This provision is unnecessary as a reporting requirement already exists under 3 CMC 1015 (k). As such, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision*.

Section 802 (c)(1)(2), Section 802 (d)

This provision requires all Commonwealth educational entities that receive Commonwealth Worker Fee Funds to submit quarterly reports to the Presiding Officers of the Legislature, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs, and the Chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means; however, strict reporting requirements already exist as per U.S. Public Law 115-218. Because this provision imposes additional and unnecessary reporting requirements, *I must respectfully exercise my authority to veto this provision*.

I extend my appreciation to the Legislature for their submission of a balance Budget for Fiscal Year 2023 and avoiding a government shutdown. May we continue to work for the improvement of the quality of life for all who call the CNMI their home, and for the betterment of the entirety of our Commonwealth. This bill except for the vetoed portions becomes **Public Law 22-22.** Copies bearing my signature are forwarded for your reference.

The House of Representatives rejected the Senate amendments and the Bill was sent to Conference, which submitted Conference Committee Report 22-2.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE TWENTY-SECOND NORTHERN MARIANAS COMMONWEALTH LEGISLATURE:

CHAPTER I. PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS.

SECTION 101. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Appropriations and Budget Authority Act of 2023".

SECTION 102. PURPOSES.

This Act appropriates local funds for the operations and activities of the Government of the Northern Mariana Islands, its agencies, instrumentalities, independent agencies and political subdivisions, and provides authority for government corporations for the Fiscal Year 2023 commencing October 1, 2022 and ending September 30, 2023.

The Secretary of Finance shall meet with the Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs and the Chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means in mid-February, mid-May and mid-August to discuss actual revenues collected versus the revenues estimated.

- (b) Comparison of Actual Expenditures and Appropriated Expenditures. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Secretary of Finance shall submit to the Presiding Officers of the Legislature, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs and the Chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means, at the end of each quarter, a fund status report comparing the actual expenditures and appropriated expenditures of all funds appropriated for the operations and activities of the Commonwealth Government in this Act.
- (c) Transfer In and Out Funds. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Secretary of Finance shall submit to the presiding officers of the Legislature, at the end of each quarter, a fund status report on the funds transferred in and out each quarter pursuant to Section 201 of this Act.
- (d) Quarterly Reports. In Fiscal Year 2023, within 30 days of the end of each quarter, the Secretary of Finance shall submit financial records covering all quarterly allotments for all local and federal funds for the CNMI Public School System, Department of Labor for Contract Workers fees, Northern Marianas Technical Institute, Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation, Northern Marianas College, and Marianas Visitors Authority to the Presiding Officers of the Legislature, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs and the Chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means.

CHAPTER III.

GOVERNMENT CORPORATIONS AND DESIGNATED AGENCIES/ACTIVITIES SECTION 301. APPROPRIATION AND BUDGET AUTHORITY.

Pursuant to 1 CMC § 7206 and as provided herein, budget and expenditure authority for the following activities is hereby approved. Expenditures in excess of the budget authority approved herein for agencies to which public funds are appropriated shall not be incurred or committed and hiring in excess of the number of positions authorized by this Act is prohibited,

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 unless authorized by a legislative joint resolution in accordance with Section 7, Article X of the N.M.I. Constitution.

Notwithstanding the above dollar amounts, the entities above shall expend only the lesser of funds actually generated, collected, or received, or the amounts indicated above.

SECTION 302. PRIOR CERTIFICATION OF FUNDS.

No contract shall be entered into with the Commonwealth or any government entity therein without first receiving from the Secretary of the Department of Finance certification that lawful and sufficient funds have been appropriated. Notwithstanding any Commonwealth laws, regulations, or provisions to the contrary, this section shall not apply to the Judicial Branch, the Public School System, and the Northern Marianas College.

SECTION 303. REPORTING REQUIREMENT.

The expenditure authorities of the foregoing activities listed in Section 301 shall submit to the Presiding Officers of the Legislature, at the end of each quarter, a fund status report on the expenditures for personnel and operations of each government entity, and the payments of the public auditor's fee, for the quarter ended and, if applicable, year-to-date totals as of the close of the reporting period.

Furthermore, notwithstanding any provisions or laws to the contrary, all additional resources realized within the fiscal year outside of those specified and identified under this Act shall be reported in detail to the Legislature for-appropriation purposes.

CHAPTER IV. ADMINISTRATION OF APPROPRIATED FUNDS

SECTION 401. MANAGEMENT OF FUNDS.

The expenditure of the funds appropriated and allocated under this Act shall be regulated and controlled by the Secretary of Finance so that no agency, department, instrumentality, program, or activity may expend the funds contrary to the law or fiscal management policies and practices of the Commonwealth. Provided further that, in addition to the report required under 1 CMC § 7209, the Secretary of Finance shall submit within 30 calendar days at the end of each quarter, a fund status report on the expenditures for personnel and operations of each business unit funded in whole or in part by the General Fund for the quarter ended and, if applicable, year-to-date totals as of the close of the reporting period.

SECTION 402. NUMBER OF POSITION(S) (NOP) CEILING.

Employment Ceilings. Pursuant to Article X, § 7 of the Commonwealth Constitution, the employment ceilings relative to the number of positions are hereby established as set forth in this Act.

SECTION 403. EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY.

The distribution and expenditure of funds shall be in compliance with the fiscal expenditure authority that the listed agencies have pursuant to the statute and the administrative provisions of this Act.

SECTION 404. IMPREST ACCOUNTS DISCONTINUED FOR THE FIRST AND SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICTS.

Due to the implementation of the MUNIS System by the Office of Information-Technology under the Department of Finance, the Imprest Accounts for the First and Second-Senatorial Districts are discontinued. The respective mayors shall use the Purchase Card, issued through E-Procurement, to pay outstanding vendor billings in a timely manner.

CHAPTER V. REPROGRAMMING AUTHORITY

SECTION 501. REPROGRAMMING AUTHORITY.

Pursuant to 1 CMC § 7402(e), all reprogramming shall be reported in writing to the Presiding Officers of the Legislature, Chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means and the Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs within 30 days after the end of each quarter of the fiscal year. Such reports shall include a description of each item

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reprogrammed, the reason for each reprogramming, the change in the approved budget caused by the reprogramming, the cumulative amount of all reprogramming during the fiscal year, and such other information as may be requested by the Chairpersons. The Governor shall submit to the Presiding Officers and Chairpersons an annual summary of all reprogramming activity within 60 days after the end of a fiscal year.

CHAPTER VI. SUPPLEMENTAL ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS SECTION 601. UTILITIES.

- (a) The CUC monthly utility billings shall be submitted to the Department of Finance in a timely manner for payment.
- (b) For prepaid meter accounts, the authorized designee of the respective government agencies or offices shall follow the protocol of the Department of Finance for timely payment.

SECTION 602. HIRING RESTRICTION.

- (a) No new or vacant position shall be filled in the executive branch, except for positions that are essential for the delivery of public services such as the Department of Public Safety and the Department of Fire and Emergency Services personnel for each respective Senatorial District and other essential positions as determined by the Governor. Provided, however, that should a need arise for an essential position, employees who have been furloughed shall have first priority.
- (b) Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary, if a Notice of Personnel Action has been executed by the hiring agency or a candidate to fill the vacancy has been selected or action has been initiated to fill the position by any department or agency and filed at the Office of Personnel Management on Rota, Tinian, or Saipan, the vacant position shall be considered as processed and to be filled. The renewal of the contract for an existing employee shall not be considered as creating a vacant position.

SECTION 603. SALARY CAP EXEMPTION.

(a) 1 CMC § 8245(c) is amended for the fiscal year 2023 to increase the annual salary of the Resident Department Heads of the First and Second Senatorial District to not more than \$45,000. The Resident Department Heads are responsible for the operations of all the divisions

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of each department and this salary exemption corresponds with their current duties and responsibilities.

(b) 1 CMC § 28003 is amended for the fiscal year 2023 to increase the annual salary of the Resident Deputy Commissioners of the Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services for the islands of Rota and Tinian to not more than \$45,000.

CHAPTER VII. APPROPRIATIONS.

SECTION 701. IN GENERAL.

Funds designated in Chapter II as available for appropriation for FY 2023 are hereby appropriated pursuant to this Chapter.

SECTION 702. APPROPRIATION.

The amount of \$109,782,265 is hereby appropriated as set forth in the attached Schedule A which is inclusive of the Department of Public Lands.

SECTION 703. JUDICIAL BRANCH.

- (a) The Number of Personnel and appropriations for personnel, operations, and utilities for the Judicial Branch shall be as shown in Schedule A.
- (b) Notwithstanding 1 CMC §7204, without prior legislative approval, no fundsappropriated to the Judicial Branch shall be reduced. The Chief Justice shall be the expenditureauthority for the Judicial Branch:
- (e) Funds appropriated for FY 2023 to the Judicial Branch shall be allotted quarterly-pursuant to 1 CMC § 7204 (e).

SECTION 704. LEGISLATIVE BRANCH.

The Number of Personnel and appropriations for personnel, operations, and utilities for the Legislative Branch shall be as shown in Schedule A.

- (a) Notwithstanding 1 CMC §7204, without prior legislative approval, no funds appropriated to the Legislature shall be reduced.
 - (b) Art. II Sec. 16(e) of the Commonwealth Constitution provides:
 - e) Beginning the second Monday of January 1998, the amount of the ceiling and all other dollar amounts stated in this section shall be adjusted every two years by the same percentage as the percentage change in the United States

Department of Commerce composite price index during the two preceding fiscal years using the beginning of the fiscal year 1996 as the base.

The appropriation ceilings have automatically increased every two years, beginning in January 1998. Using the price composite indexes developed by the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis for State and Local Government Consumption Expenditures and Gross Investment, the appropriation ceilings for the Legislature for fiscal years 2022 and 2023 are as follows:

- (e) Funds appropriated for FY 2023 to the Legislative Branch shall be allotted quarterly pursuant to 1 CMC § 7204 (e).
 - (d) Salaries of Legislative Members.
 - (1) The amount appropriated under this section to the House of Representatives under "personnel" shall be used to fund the salaries and benefits of the members of the House of Representatives. The expenditure authority for the amounts appropriated shall be the Speaker of the House.
 - (2) The amount appropriated under this section to the Senate under "personnel" shall be used to fund the salaries and benefits of the members of the Senate. The expenditure authority for the amounts appropriated shall be the President of the Senate. (e) Members' Office Accounts and Employees.
 - (1) Notwithstanding 1 CMC §7401(c) to the contrary, each member shall be the expenditure authority of the funds appropriated to their individual sub-account;
 - (2) Funds appropriated for the operation of the member's office, including, but not limited to, the personnel costs of the member's employees and expenditures as authorized by the adopted rules of the Senate in the case of the Senate member, or the adopted rules of the House of Representatives in the case of a House member, or the Legislative Bureau, may be expended to defray travel and incidental expenses for the

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purpose of attending to legislative business; provided that a member may receive a onemonth advancement of funds appropriated to his or her office for expenditures;

- (3) Appropriation of the maximum number of positions among House members shall be governed by the rules of the House; and
- (4) Appropriation of the maximum number of positions among Senate members shall be governed by the rules of the Senate.
- (f) Senate and House Leadership Accounts. The leadership account of each house shall be \$200,000. The presiding officer of each respective house, or his lawfully authorized designee, shall be the expenditure authority and shall use such funds to support the operations and activities of the House of Representatives and Senate in accordance with its rules, provided that the presiding officer distributes a portion of the total appropriation in equal amounts to all the standing committees for their operations and activities.
- (g) Legislative Bureau, BU 1770. The Number of Personnel and appropriations for personnel, operations, and utilities for the Legislative Bureau shall be as shown in Schedule A. The expenditure authority of the funds appropriated for the Legislative Bureau shall be the Director of the Legislative Bureau or authorized designee.
- (h) Northern Marianas Youth Congress, BU 1593. The Number of Personnel and appropriations for personnel and operations for Youth Congress shall be as shown in Schedule A. The expenditure authority is vested in the Director of the Legislative Bureau with the consent of the Speaker of the Northern Mariana Islands Youth Congress.

SECTION 705. EXECUTIVE BRANCH.

The appropriation for the Executive Branch shall be as shown in Schedule A.

- (a) The Governor shall have authority to expend, obligate, encumber, or otherwise commit, all the funds appropriated to the Office of the Governor and all Other Offices of the Governor.
- (b) The Lt. Governor shall be the expenditure authority of the funds appropriated to the Office of the Lt. Governor.
- (c) Under other offices of the Governor, Business Unit 1951, Medicaid Reimbursements, the Secretary of Finance shall reserve \$7.2 million of FEMA Community Disaster Loan to fund the local Medicaid matching. Provided further the amount of 13.5 million

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- U.S. Dollars shall be allotted from the FEMA Community Disaster Loan to fund the 25% of the Commonwealth government's obligation to CNMI Retirees for Fiscal Year 2023.
- (d) Of the twenty-one NOPs allotted to Youth Services-Saipan, BU 1220, two NOPs shall be set aside to employ two Emergency Shelter Workers.
- (e) Of the seven NOPs allotted to the Environmental Quality Saipan, BU 1493, three NOPs shall be set aside to employ three Litter Control Officers.

SECTION 706. <u>FIRST SENATORIAL DISTRICT - MAYOR OF ROTA AND ROTA</u> MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Number of Personnel and appropriations for personnel, operations, and utilities for the First Senatorial District shall be as shown in Schedule A.

- (a) Except as provided in this section, the Mayor of Rota shall have authority to expend, obligate, encumber, and otherwise commit, all the funds appropriated to the First Senatorial District. The appropriations to the Municipal Council shall be under the expenditure authority of the Municipal Council Chairperson. Additionally, except as provided in this section, in accord with the Superior Court's decision in the case of *Inos v. Tenorio*, the Mayors shall also have expenditure authority over resident government departments in the First and Second Senatorial districts respectively unless the Governor revokes expenditure authority in a manner consistent with the Superior Court's holding in *Inos v. Tenorio*, to wit: expenditure authority over resident departments that are primarily concerned with the delivery of public services can be revoked only on a prior showing of just cause, but the Governor has the discretion to revoke expenditure authority over those departments that are primarily concerned with enforcing the law.
- (b) Of the five NOPs allotted to Finance & Accounting Rota, BU 1112, one NOP shall be set aside to employ an Account Clerk I.
- (c) Any shortfall in the appropriated funds as a result or due to payment of overtime, retirement, or benefits shall be borne by the municipality.

SECTION 707. SECOND SENATORIAL DISTRICT - MAYOR OF TINIAN & AGUIGUAN AND TINIAN MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Number of Personnel and appropriations for personnel, operations, and utilities for the Second Senatorial District shall be as shown in Schedule A.

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- (a) Except as provided in this section, the Mayor of Tinian and Aguiguan shall have authority to expend, obligate, encumber, or otherwise commit or reprogram, all the funds appropriated to the Second Senatorial District. The appropriations to the Municipal Council shall be under the expenditure authority of the Municipal Council Chairperson. Additionally, in accord with the Superior Court's decision in the case of *Inos v. Tenorio*, the Mayors shall also have expenditure authority over resident government departments in the First and Second senatorial districts respectively unless the Governor revokes expenditure authority in a manner consistent with the Superior Court's holding in *Inos v. Tenorio*, to wit: expenditure authority over resident departments that are primarily concerned with the delivery of public services can be revoked only on a prior showing of just cause, but the Governor has the discretion to revoke expenditure authority over those departments that are primarily concerned with enforcing the law.
- (b) The Tobacco Settlement Agreement funds allocated to the Second Senatorial District shall fund the two new ABTC Law Enforcement NOPs for the Department of Commerce-Tinian.
- (c) Notwithstanding any laws to the contrary, \$70,000 from the developer's infrastructure tax for the Second Senatorial District under Business Unit 3731 shall fund the certified civil engineer under the Department of Public Works Tinian.
- (d) Any shortfall in the appropriated funds as a result or due to payment of overtime, retirement, or benefits shall be borne by the municipality.

SECTION 708. THIRD SENATORIAL DISTRICT – MAYOR OF SAIPAN; MAYOR OF THE NORTHERN ISLANDS; AND SAIPAN AND NORTHERN ISLANDS MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Number of Personnel and appropriations for personnel, operations, and utilities for the Office of the Mayor of Saipan, Office of the Mayor of the Northern Islands, and the Saipan and Northern Islands Municipal Council shall be as shown in Schedule A.

The Mayor of Saipan, the Mayor of the Northern Islands, and the Chairperson of the Municipal Council for Saipan and the Northern Islands or each of their respective designees shall be the expenditure authority for appropriations for their respective offices.

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SECTION 709. OTHER PROGRAMS.

The FY 2023 Budget Appropriation for the programs under this section shall be as shown in Schedule A.

- (a) Northern Marianas College. The President of the Northern Marianas College or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the funds under BU 1605.
- (b) NMC Board of Regents. The Chairperson of the Board of Regents of the Northern Marianas College or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds under BU 1627.
- (c) Public School System. The Commissioner of Education or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds under BU 1607. Funds appropriated to PSS shall not be used for personnel and operations of the Board of Education.
- (d) Board of Education. The Chairperson of the Board of Education or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds under BU 1624. The funds appropriated to the Board of Education shall include the cost and expenses of the student and teacher representatives to the Board of Education.
- (e) CNMI Medical Referral Program (Health Network Program). The Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation shall administer the CNMI Medical Referral Program or its successor, including both inter-island and off-island referrals, consistent with its duties and responsibilities under 3 CMC 2821 et seq. The expenditure authority for all funds appropriated or allocated to inter-island and off-island medical referral services and administration (inclusive of BU 1979, 1979A, and any new business units established for CHCC Medical Referral) shall be the CEO of the Commonwealth Healthcare Corporation or designee.
- (f) Northern Marianas Technical Institute. The Chairperson of the Board of Trustees or designee in consultation with the Chief Executive Officer shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds for the Northern Marianas Technical Institute.

SECTION 710. INDEPENDENT PROGRAMS.

The FY 2023 budget appropriation for the agencies under this section shall be as shown in Schedule A.

(a) Joeten-Kiyu Public Library. The Chairperson of the Commonwealth Library Council or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the allocated funds.

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- (b) NMI Museum of History and Culture. The Chairperson of the Board of Governors of the NMI Museum of History and Culture or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds.
- (c) Elected Attorney General. The Attorney General or designee shall be the expenditure authority of the appropriated funds. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Office of the Attorney General may charge fees for legal services provided to CNMI public corporations and autonomous agencies; provided that the Office of the Attorney General shall not charge fees for legal services provided to divisions, offices, and line agencies within the executive branch with the exception of the Department of Public Lands, the Division of Revenue and Taxation, the Bureau of Environmental and Coastal Quality, and the Office of Management and Budget.
- (d) The expenditure authority of the funds appropriated for the Public Assistance Program shall be the Governor's Authorized Representative.
- (e) Medicaid Program. The funds appropriated in this Act for the Medicaid Program, including Medicaid Reimbursement, BU 1951, Medicaid Agency, BU 1980, and Medicaid Enterprise Systems (MES), BU 1981 shall be deemed a single budget reserved for the purposes of Medicaid Agency, Medicaid Reimbursement, and Medicaid Enterprise Systems. The Director of the Commonwealth Medicaid Agency may reallocate the funds appropriated in this Act to any of the expenditure categories, including, but not limited to, Agency, Reimbursement, and Medicaid Enterprise Systems. Provided further that for the Fiscal Year 2023, pursuant to the request of CNMI Medicaid, with the concurrence of the Office of Personnel Management, notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, all of the 12 NOPs for the Medicaid Enterprise Systems & Health Information Technology funded under BU 1981 shall be excepted service contract employees.
- (f) For programs and activities not specifically mentioned, the expenditure authority shall be the Secretary of Finance.

SECTION 711. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC LANDS.

Pursuant to 1 CMC §2803, \$5,407,896 is appropriated to the Department of Public Lands.

SECTION 712. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.

(a) The expenditure authorities of the foregoing activities listed in Chapter VII shall submit to the presiding officers of the legislature, within 30 days after the end of each quarter, a fund status report on the expenditures for personnel and operations of each government entity, and the payments of the public auditor's fee, for the quarter ended and, if applicable, year-to-date totals as of the close of the reporting period. Failure to report on the expenditures of such funds by each respective government entity shall result in a suspension of their future, allocations until the delayed quarterly report has been submitted to the presiding officers of the legislature.

(b) Access Provided to Legislative Fiscal Analysts.

Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, training and access to the following shall be provided:

(A) the Munis Financial Management Information System or other financial and accounting system to obtain the following: monthly collections and expenditures, including but not limited to funds status, and detailed expenditure reports in a format that is exportable or convertible to Excel files; and

- (B) the following reports in a format that is exportable or convertible to Excel files shall be provided to the CNMI Legislative Fiscal Analysts 30 days after the effective date of this Act:
 - (i) All revolving accounts;
 - (ii) All business activities listed in Schedule A;-
 - (iii) All accounts listed as earmarks in the Budget Authority Act;
 - (iv) All debt service payments, including payments to the Settlement Fund, and Series A and Series B Funds;
- (v) All revenue accounts in the First, Second, and Third Senatorial Districts that are identified as budgetary resources in the Budget Authority Act;

 (C) Any other financial information, not legally privileged or protected, relating to the CNMI Government's expenditure of public funds, as needed and requested, in writing, within 10 days of said request.

SECTION 713. VIOLATIONS OF SPENDING LIMITS.

The expenditure of funds in excess of appropriations and reprogramming established by this Act is a violation of the Planning and Budget Act, 1 CMC § 7101 et seq. Any expenditure authority that violates The Planning and Budget Act shall be suspended without salary for at least 30 days and the salary shall not be restored until a fiscal plan is submitted to the Presiding Officers of the Legislature, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Fiscal-Affairs, and the Chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means, and accepted by both houses of the Legislature to retire the over-expenditure. Provided, they also shall not be entitled to indemnification, defense, or reimbursement under the Government Liability Act or any other Commonwealth Law.

CHAPTER VIII. OUTSIDE SOURCES

SECTION 801. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS.

- (a) The following amounts from sources outside the General Fund are available for appropriation.
- (b) Notwithstanding 1 CMC § 7204, the outside source funds appropriated for FY 2023 shall be allotted monthly; except programs that require one-time payments may receive advance allotments.
- (c) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Secretary of Finance shall submit to the presiding officers of the Legislature, at the end of each quarter, a fund status report on the outside-sourced funds that are transferred in and out of government business units and their respective accounts, pursuant to Section 802 of this Act.
- (d) All salaries of elected officials that are waived under 1 CMC § 8442 shall be transferred by the Secretary of Finance to the Scholarship Trust Account and the funds from the account shall be spent for scholarship purposes only, without further appropriation, and without fiscal year limitation. The Administrator of the CNMI Scholarship Office shall provide a report to the presiding officers of the legislature within 30 days after the end of each quarter.

SECTION 802. OUTSIDE SOURCES.

(a) **Tobacco Settlement Funds**. Pursuant to 3 CMC §2173 and the funds allocated in this section pursuant to the submittal of a program and expenditure plan to the Secretary of

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Finance, the Tobacco Settlement funds in the amount of \$540,000, not subject to reprogramming or fiscal year limitation, shall be allocated as follows:

(1) Division of Public Health 40%:	\$216,000
(2) Public School System 20%:	\$108,000
(3) Youth Affairs Office 12.5%:	\$67,500
(4) Coalition of Private Schools 7.5%:	\$40,500
(5) Rota Mayor 10%:	\$54,000
(6) Tinian and Aguiguan Mayor 10%:	\$54,000

The expenditure authorities of the funds allocated pursuant to this Section 802(a) shall be the persons authorized by law for each respective office or agency. The expenditure authorities shall provide accountability and transparency by providing within 30 days after the end of each quarter an expenditure report of the funds to the governor and the presiding officers of the Legislature.

- (b) Compact Impact. The Compact Impact fund in the amount of \$1,629,879 shall be allocated in accordance with relevant data submitted by the affected agencies.
 - (c) Commonwealth Worker Fund (Source: U.S.P.L. 115-218).

In accordance with U.S. Public Law 115-218, the sum of \$1,500,000 in Commonwealth Worker Fee Funds shall be available for the sole and exclusive purpose of funding vocational education, apprenticeships, or other training programs for United States workers by Commonwealth educational entities for FY 2023. Provided that out of the \$1,500,000, the following amounts shall be allocated for the sole and exclusive purpose of funding vocational education, apprenticeships, or other vocational training programs for United States workers.

- (1) The expenditure authorities of all Commonwealth educational entities thatreceive Commonwealth Worker Fee Funds shall submit to the Presiding Officers of the-Legislature, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Fiscal Affairs and the Chairperson of the House Committee on Ways and Means, at the end of each quarter; a fund status report of the funds allocated under this subsection.
- (2) The recipients of the funds in this subsection shall submit to the Governorand the Department of Labor the required education plans consistent with and mandatedby U.S. Public Law 115-218. The funds allocated pursuant to this subsection shall not-



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be used or reprogrammed for any other purpose other than in accordance with U.S. Public Law 115-218. The funds allocated under this subsection are not subject to fiscal-vear limitation.

(d) Reporting Requirement. The expenditure authorities of the funds allocated-pursuant to Section 802 shall provide accountability and transparency by providing within 30-days after the end of each quarter an expenditure report of the funds to the governor and the presiding officers of the Legislature.

CHAPTER IX. GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 901. SEVERABILITY.

If any provision of this Act, or its application to any person or circumstance, is held invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of the Act which can be given effect without the invalid provision or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

SECTION 902. SAVINGS CLAUSE.

This Act and any repealer contained herein shall not be construed as affecting any existing right acquired under contract or acquired under statutes repealed or under any rule, regulation or order adopted under the statutes. Repealers contained in this Act shall not affect any proceeding instituted under or pursuant to prior law. The enactment of this Act shall not have the effect of terminating, or in any way modifying, any liability civil or criminal, which shall already be in existence at the date this Act becomes effective.

SECTION 903. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor, or its becoming law without such approval.
